The day will also have a musical flair with live performances by The Derailers, Bob Livingston's Cowboys & Indians, and kid favorite Joe McDermott. Admission to the Rainwater Revival is free. The event will take place on the grounds of Roger Hanks Park in Dripping Springs, Texas.

The Rainwater Revival promises something for every level of rainwater harvesting knowledge, from the rainwater curious to ardent rainwater enthusiasts.

With songs and yodels from Texas, and ragas and chants from India, Cowboys & Indians are pioneers of "country 'n eastern music." And the kids will be rocking to the beat when Parents' Choice Award winner, singer/songwriter, and "maestro of the imagination" Joe McDermott takes the stage.
