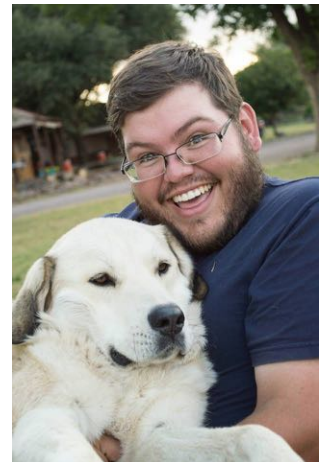
**Alan W. Rossing****Lakota Water Company**

These systems include nuclear power plants, refineries, semiconductors, bottled water plants, dialysis sites, universities and mining companies. Alan has been published in the *Ultrapure Water* magazine and co-authored *On-line Biocide Injection For Microbiological Control In Reverse Osmosis Systems*.

Since 2002, Alan has overseen the design, installation, and ongoing maintenance of more than 700 water systems for both rainwater collection and well or city water treatment. These systems include both residential and commercial customers nationwide. In addition, he offers water treatment consultation and rainwater system inspection services.
