Local Taskforce Check-In

- Bandera
 - Several smaller meetings have occurred so far
 - Scheduling a joint meeting with the Chamber to bring local businesses to the table
 - The county is researching what to do with Mansfield Park, the largest park in the county
 - The first official county meeting will take place in March with all department heads
 - Brainstorming events to host to get folks in town early and keep them around afterward
 - A new fire marshal will be joining the group soon
- Blanco

 - Currently changing coordinators
- Burnet
 - In the initial phase of forming a taskforce

Gillespie

- The task force has divided into subgroups and has been meeting quarterly, preparing to start meeting every other month
- Next week will be talking about action items and assignments
 - Creating websites for tourists and residents
 - Preparing 2023 budget
 - Assessing the need to modify ordinances
 - Discussing school closures

Hays

- Dripping Springs will start meeting next month
- o Information emails have gone out to 90+ lodging partners

Kendall

- The City of Boerne is working on getting more folks engaged
- o The next meeting is planned for Feb/Mar

Kerr

- City Council is meeting next week with the city council
- Working to convene with stakeholders
- o Budgeting begins Feb/Mar

Lampasas

- Taskforce formed with the EDC, with the Fire Chief taking on coordinating all safety aspects
- o Created entertainment and website subcommittees
- Eclipse glasses have been ordered
- The task force has been giving presentations, and an article was submitted to the local newspaper
- o All RV parks are sold out
- Vision Lampasas has budgeted to purchase glasses and t-shirts and will use the profit from sales to fund the purchase of more

Medina

- A meeting of key players (mayors, city manager, chief of police) was held at the end of last July
- Each municipality was tasked with determining their level of involvement and the type of events they want to hold
- The next meeting is set for February

Real

- Held first county-wide meeting a few months ago
- Presented to the commissioner's court last month by invitation (they were a bit shell shocked, but the lodging industry is aware of upcoming eclipses)
- Working on getting invites to city council meetings
- Reviewed HCA Partner Guide and working on getting folks assigned to areas of note
- Meeting quarterly, with the next meeting in March

Uvalde

- o Coordinating with neighboring communities soon
- o Glasses have been ordered
- o The preliminary website is up, https://www.uvaldecountysolareclipse.com/
- Information email has gone out to lodging owners
- Working on outlining and proposing a solar eclipse coordinator for the county to serve as the point of contact
